

Call for a sustainable EU collaboration:

The second Commission report on the implementation of the Recommendation 2009/C 151/01

The Council Conclusions on Patient Safety and Quality of Care of 1 December 2014 invite the Member States and the Commission to set up, by December 2016, a framework for a sustainable EU collaboration on patient safety and quality of care.

The European Union Network for Patient Safety and Quality of Care, PaSQ Joint Action calls for a permanent network on Patient Safety and Quality of Care



Council Conclusions Invitations for the Commission

Better coordination of EU activities on patient safety and quality of care;

Monitoring developments in patient safety in Member States and the main causes of adverse events;

Work on information to patients on patient safety and on quality of healthcare;




Council Conclusions Invitations for MS and EC

Work towards measuring and improving patient safety culture;

Promote the collection of information on adverse events;

Develop EU guidance for patient/citizens' involvement in strategies on patient safety; Develop guidelines on how to establish patient safety standards;

Develop further work on the dimensions of quality in healthcare





Financing

2015: preparatory work for future actions, e.g. mapping of existing knowledge on measuring patient safety culture;

mapping of methodologies of setting up guidelines and standards in patient safety and quality of care;

mapping existing sources of information to patients on safety and quality of healthcare
